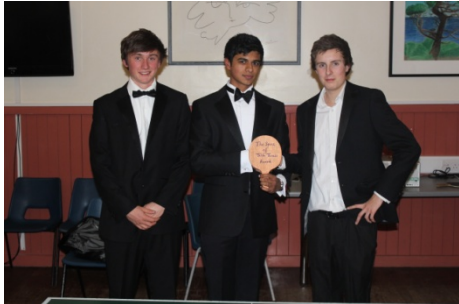


East Town December 2011
